This responds to your July 14, 2006, information request received in this Office on July 18, 2006, and assigned the above-referenced tracking number for processing under the Freedom of Information (FOIA) and Privacy Acts and related rules.^{1/} 5 U.S.C. §§ 552-552a; 28 CFR § 16.1, *et seq.*

Your request states in pertinent part as follows:

This is a request pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act. The records requested are as follows:

records of studies conducted by the EOUST or any regional office of the US Trustee of (1) the costs of fee application preparation in Chapter 11 bankruptcy cases or (2) compliance with section (b)(4)of the US Trustee's Guidelines for Reviewing Applications for Compensation and Reimbursement of Expenses Filed Under 11 U.S.C. 330, 28 CFR Pt. 58, App. A as that section relates to fee application preparation.

Before further processing your request, please confirm the scope of your request, memorialized above, and clarify the information that you requesting in accordance with the Department of Justice FOIA regulations cited below.

(1) Intended Use. Based on the statutory standard for fee categories, OMB Fee Guidelines, Department regulations, and all of the information available to me, I conclude that for purposes of your request, you qualify as a representative of an educational institution, whose purpose is scholarly research. See 5 U.S.C. \$552(a)(4)(A)(ii)(II). This means that you may be charged only for the direct costs of duplication of the releasable records. By statute, requesters in the "educational institution" fee category are entitled to the first 100 pages of duplication without cost. See 5 U.S.C. \$552(a)(4)(A)(iv)(II).

(2) <u>Fee Commitment</u>. While the submission of a FOIA request constitutes an implied "agreement by you to pay all applicable fees . . . up to \$25," an *express* fee commitment is needed where fees may exceed \$25; and, where fees may exceed \$250, an advance payment will also be required before further processing a FOIA request. <u>See</u> 28 CFR §§ 16.3(c), 16.11(e). Your request states that:

In order to help to determine my status for purposes of determining the applicability of any fees, you should know that I am affiliated with an educational institution and this request is made for a scholarly prupose and not for a commercial use. We preliminarily estimate that your \$50 fee commitment will not be exceeded; however, we confirm your request to contact you if we exceed your \$50 commitment. Please remit no fees prior to billing.

(3) <u>Scope Clarification</u>. As our FOIA regulations state, "[y]ou must describe the records that you seek in enough detail to enable Department personnel to locate them with a reasonable amount of effort." 28 CFR § 16.3(b).² Clarification is needed so that we may properly process your request.

(4) <u>Privacy Requirements</u>. We understand that you are seeking Program studies related to fee applications. Please note, however, that to the extent any third-party information about a living individual record-subject protected under the Privacy Act appears in any responsive documents, processing such records may entail significant time for legal review and redaction prior to disclosure, absent record-subject consent or other legal authorization for disclosure of third-party information.^{3/}

For the foregoing reasons, if you wish us to further process your information request, please clarify it as noted above on or before August 21, 2006. We will close our file in this matter if we do not receive a response by that date.

Department regulations provide that you may appeal this decision by lodging an administrative appeal with the Office of Information and Privacy, Department of Justice, 1425 New York Ave., NW, Suite 11050, Washington, DC 20530-0001, within 60 days of this letter. (Both the letter and envelope should be marked "FOIA Appeal.") If you are dissatisfied with the results of any such administrative appeal, judicial review may thereafter be available in U.S. District Court. 28 CFR § 16.9.

This responds to your July 14, 2006, information request received in this Office on July 18, 2006, as modified by your July 28 response to our July 20 request for clarification. Your request was assigned the above-referenced tracking number for processing under the Freedom of Information (FOIA) and Privacy Acts and related rules.^{1/2} 5 U.S.C. §§ 552-552a; 28 CFR § 16.1, <u>et seq</u>.

The United States Trustee Program is a component of the Department of Justice and is responsible for overseeing the administration of bankruptcy cases and private estate trustees. <u>See, e.g.</u>, 11 U.S.C. § 101, <u>et seq.</u>; 28 U.S.C. § 586. The United States Trustee Offices in New York, New York; Wilmington, Delaware; Philadelphia, Pennsylvania; and Chicago, Illinois; as well as the Executive Office for United States Trustees in Washington, DC, performed local searches of their files, but found no responsive documents regarding "1) the costs of fee application preparation in Chapter 11 bankruptcy cases or 2) compliance with section (b)(4) of the US Trustee's Guidelines for Reviewing Applications for Compensation and Reimbursement of Expenses Filed Under 11 U.S.C. 330, 28 CFR Pt. 58.
