EID # 38-3196719		FIRST APPLICATION OF GERALD K. SMITH AS TRUSTEE OF THE BOSTON CHICKEN PLAN TRUST FOR COMPENSATION FOR THE PERIOD SHORTLY BEFORE APPOINTMENT THROUGH JANUARY 31, 2001

Gerald K. Smith, for his application for fees, respectfully represents as follows:

- The Chapter 11 Plan of BCI and its 23 affiliates was confirmed
   May 15, 2000. The Confirmation Order became effective May 26, 2000.
- As provided in the Third Modified Plan dated May 3, 2000, Gerald K.
   Smith was nominated as Trustee and the Court approved that nomination and appointed
   Gerald K. Smith as Trustee by Order dated May 15, 2000.
- 3. Prior to the appointment, time was spent working with employees of Boston Chicken, Inc. and Akin, Gump, Strauss, Hauer & Feld, L.L.P., general counsel for the debtors, preparing for matters that had to be dealt with promptly after confirmation of



the Plan and appointment of the Trustee. As a result, approximately 28.2 hours were spent on Trust affairs the Trustee prior to by appointment prior to his appointment as Trustee.

- 4. Pursuant to the Plan, this Court is to review and approve any compensation requested by the Trustee. *See* Paragraph IV(B), page 12, of the Third Modified Plan.
- 5. An itemization of the Trustee's time, through January 2001 is attached as Exhibit A. The Trustee has spent 1,164.7 hours for which compensation at the Trustee's then standard hourly rate of \$350 is requested for all but 1.9 hours noted in the itemization. The time has been kept and presented under three categories, Administration, Claims Investigation and Einstein/Noah Bagel Corp. The compensation requested is \$406,980.
- 6. In a general sense, the time on matters other than Einstein/Noah Bagel Corp. concern the overall administration and windup of the affairs of a large business. Although some information had been accumulated prior to confirmation as to priority and secured claims, much remained to be done. In addition, it was necessary to oversee the closing of 87 restaurants and the sale of personal property at more than 100 closed restaurants. It was also necessary to assemble a staff and hire professionals to wind up the corporations, prepare and file hundreds of tax returns, conduct the investigation of claims of the estate, hire counsel to pursue such claims, sell five parcels of real estate, process hundreds of administrative claims, and arrange for the preparation and filing of Form 5500's as to the 401(k) plans, arrange for the necessary audit of such plans, process and oversee the preparation and distribution of thousands of W-2's, W-3's, and 1099's,



and arrange for the preparation and filing of income tax returns for fiscal years 1999 and 2000

- 7. Much has been accomplished, 39 suits have been filed seeking to recover preferences, fraudulent transfers, and losses sustained by the debtors. Fee applications have been reviewed, objected to, and resolved except for three fee applications which should be resolved by litigation later this year.
- 8. An unexpected and time consuming activity has been the attempt to recover the value of the Trust's stock in Einstein/Noah Bagel Corp. This is ongoing and it is too early to predict the outcome.

WHEREFORE, based on the time spent by the Trustee as listed in the detailed itemization attached as Exhibit A to this Application, it is respectfully requested that the Court award the Trustee compensation of \$406,980 for the period covered by the Trustee's First Application.
