**FINAL APPLICATION OF LEBOEUF, LAMB, GREENE & MACRAE, L.L.P.,
FOR COMPENSATION AND REIMBURSEMENT PURSUANT TO 11 U.S.C.
§ 330 FOR THE PERIOD FROM CASE COMMENCEMENT THROUGH
PLAN EFFECTIVE DATE (JANUARY 3, 2001)**

LeBoeuf, Lamb, Greene & MacRae, L.L.P. ("LeBoeuf"), bankruptcy co-counsel to Geneva Steel Company (the "Debtor"), pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 330, Federal Rule of Bankruptcy Procedure 2016, and the Fee Guidelines of the United States Trustee, submits this final application (the "Application") for allowance and payment of: (1) compensation in the total amount of \$1,635,434.00 for services rendered, and (2) reimbursement in the total amount of \$171,315.23 for expenses incurred,

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for the period from case commencement¹ through January 3, 2001 (the "Application Period").

I. INTRODUCTION

A. Case Background

1. The Debtor owns and operates the only integrated steel mill operating in the western United States, located approximately 45 miles south of Salt Lake City in Vineyard, Utah County, Utah. The Debtor manufactures steel products for sale primarily in the western and central United States.

2. On February 1, 1999 (the "Petition Date"), the Debtor filed a petition for relief under chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code. From the Petition Date to January 3, 2001, the Debtor operated its business as a debtor in possession pursuant to the Bankruptcy Code. On January 3, 2001, the Debtor's confirmed plan of reorganization became effective.

3. The Debtor has or will have sufficient available funds to pay administrative expense claims in this case. All quarterly fees due to the United States Trustee have been paid, and the Debtor filed all required monthly financial reports.

4. The Court has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 157 and 1334. This is a core proceeding pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 157(b)(2).

5. Descriptions of major events throughout the course of the case are included

¹Debtor filed its petition for relief on February 1, 1999. However, a small portion of the fees and expenses sought by LeBoeuf in its first interim fee application, and as noted in that application, were incurred prior to February 1, 1999. LeBoeuf was retained by the Debtor on January 29, 1999 to assist in the preparation and filing of this case. All fees and costs incurred prior to February 1, 1999 related solely to the preparation and filing of the case and motions filed with the petition and, under applicable law in this district are allowable as administrative expenses. See In re Roberts, 46 B.R. 815, 849 (Bankr. D. Utah 1985) (pre-petition fees and costs owed to law firm incurred solely for services rendered in contemplation of an in connection with the bankruptcy are recoverable as part of fees allowed under Sections 327, 329, and 330 of the Code).

below in the summaries by project category of the services provided by LeBoeuf.

B. LeBoeuf's Employment

1. On the Petition Date, the Debtor filed an application (the "Employment Application") seeking approval of its employment of LeBoeuf as co-counsel, along with the firm of Cadwalader, Wickersham & Taft ("CWT"), for this bankruptcy case. The Court entered an order on March 22, 1999 (the "Employment Order") approving the Debtor's employment of LeBoeuf as follows: "pursuant to section 327(a) of the Bankruptcy Code, the Debtor, as debtor in possession, is authorized to employ and retain LeBoeuf as counsel under a general retainer effective as of the commencement of this case."

2. Although a cash retainer for LeBoeuf was contemplated prior to the commencement of this case, the retainer was not paid, at LeBoeuf's request made in consideration of the Debtor's cash position at the time. Thus, LeBoeuf received no retainer in this case.

3. The Debtor's employment and retention of CWT as general bankruptcy counsel in this case also were approved by the Court. The Employment Application for LeBoeuf states that "[a]lthough CWT may consult with LeBoeuf on matters of local practice and procedure, CWT and LeBoeuf have assured the Debtor that they will make every effort to avoid and/or minimize duplication of services in this case." Employment Application at 3. The services performed by LeBoeuf have not been unnecessarily duplicative of those performed by CWT.

4. All services performed and expenses incurred for which compensation or reimbursement is sought were performed or incurred for and on behalf of the estate and not for any other person or entity.

5. LeBoeuf has not shared or agreed to share compensation or reimbursement

awarded in this case with any other person except as among the members and employees of the firm.

6. LeBoeuf has not made any agreements with the Debtor or others for compensation or reimbursement relating to this case which have not been disclosed to the Court.

II. PRIOR APPLICATIONS FOR COMPENSATION AND REIMBURSEMENT

A. LeBoeuf's First Interim Application for Compensation and Reimbursement

LeBoeuf's first interim application for compensation and reimbursement (the "First Application") was filed on July 15, 1999 and covered the period from the commencement of the case through May 31, 1999. The First Application sought approval of \$556,619.50 in fees for services rendered to the estate, and \$51,302.51 in expenses incurred in connection with those services. On September 16, 1999, the Court entered an order approving the amount of fees and expenses requested in the First Application.

B. LeBoeuf's Second Interim Application for Compensation and Reimbursement

LeBoeuf's second interim application for compensation and reimbursement (the "Second Application"), filed November 11, 1999 for the period June 1, 1999 through September 30, 1999, sought approval of \$199,044.50 in fees for services rendered to the estate and \$21,420.51 in expenses incurred in connection with those services. On February 1, 2000, the Court entered an order approving the amount of fees and expenses requested in the Second Application.

C. LeBoeuf's Third Interim Application for Compensation and Reimbursement

LeBoeuf's third interim application for compensation and reimbursement (the "Third Application"), filed March 14, 2000 for the period October 1, 1999 through January 31, 2000, sought approval of \$178,846.00 in fees for services rendered to the estate and \$11,968.76 in expenses incurred in connection with those services. On May 30, 2000, the Court entered an order approving

the amount of fees and expenses requested in the Third Application.

D. LeBoeuf's Fourth Interim Application for Compensation and Reimbursement

LeBoeuf's fourth interim application for compensation and reimbursement (the "Fourth Application"), filed July 11, 2000 for the period February 1, 1999 through May 31, 2000, sought approval of \$181,152.50 in fees for services rendered to the estate and \$13,667.71 in expenses incurred in connection with those services. On October 17, 2000, the Court entered an order approving the amount of fees and expenses requested in the Fourth Application.

E. LeBoeuf's Fifth Interim Application for Compensation and Reimbursement

LeBoeuf's fifth interim application for compensation and reimbursement (the "Fifth Application"), filed November 15, 2000 for the period June 1, 2000 through September 30, 2000, sought approval of \$247,990.75 in fees for services rendered to the estate and \$29,947.95 in expenses incurred in connection with those services. On January 31, 2001, the Court entered an order approving the amount of fees and expenses requested in the Fifth Application.

III. THE PRESENT APPLICATION

A. Billing Methodology

1. In this Application, LeBoeuf is requesting compensation for services provided and reimbursement of expenses incurred during the entire Application Period, including (a) fees and expenses previously approved by the Court on an interim basis pursuant to LeBoeuf's five interim applications described above (covering the period from case commencement through September 30, 2000), and (b) an additional \$254,975.25 in fees and \$42,998.92 in expenses for the period October 1, 2000 through January 3, 2001 (the "Current Period"). A summary of fees requested for the entire Application Period is attached hereto as Exhibit 4. A Summary of the expenses incurred broken down

by project category and by type of expense for the entire Application Period is attached hereto as Exhibit 5. Invoices detailing the services rendered during each of the prior interim periods were provided in LeBoeuf's five interim fee applications on file with the Court. A summary of fees for the Current Period (October 1, 2000 through January 3, 2001) is attached hereto as Exhibit 1. Invoices detailing the services rendered and expenses incurred for the Current Period are attached hereto as Exhibit 2A (invoice for October 2000), Exhibit 2B (invoice for November 2000), Exhibit 2C (invoice for December 2000), and Exhibit 2D (invoice for January 2001). A summary of the expenses incurred, broken down by project category and by type of expense, for the Current Period is attached hereto as Exhibit 3.

2. LeBoeuf's services in this case are billed on an hourly-rate basis, consistent with LeBoeuf's customary charges for comparably skilled and experienced practitioners in other bankruptcy and non-bankruptcy cases. This Application requests compensation at the local, rather than the national, rates ordinarily charged by LeBoeuf for its attorneys resident in its Salt Lake City office for large matters of national scope. The fees for the Current Period are based on two hourly rates, as shown in the charts included herein, because LeBoeuf's hourly rates increased nationwide for all clients on November 1, 2000.

3. In rendering services and incurring expenses on behalf of the estate, LeBoeuf makes reasonable efforts to use the most economical means and methods that are available and appropriate under the circumstances.

4. The education and experience of the LeBoeuf attorneys providing service on behalf of the Debtor during the Application Period are detailed in the professional resumes attached hereto as Exhibit 6. Two attorneys with whom the Court is not familiar performed work in the Current

Period. Everette James, a partner in LeBoeuf's Washington D.C. office, assisted with issues pertaining to the Emergency Steel Loan Guaranty Program. H. Glen Alberich, a partner in LeBoeuf's Boston office, assisted with a deposition taken in Boston in the litigation brought by Loomis Sayles & Co.

5. Given the education, experience, and expertise of the LeBoeuf attorneys rendering services in this case, the rates charged are reasonable, and they are the same as or lower than rates LeBoeuf typically charges to clients for similar services.

B. Services Performed on Behalf of the Estate

1. During the Application Period, LeBoeuf rendered services to the estate for which it seeks compensation in the total amount of \$1,635,434.00. Such services for each of the interim periods from case commencement through September 30, 2000, are detailed in the monthly invoices provided in LeBoeuf's five interim fee applications already on file with the Court. Such services for the Current Period are detailed in the monthly invoices attached hereto as Exhibits 2A through 2D.

2. LeBoeuf has categorized the time spent performing services for the estate into the following project categories, consistent with the guidelines of the U.S. Trustee:

Details of the expenses incurred each month for the Current Period are included in the invoices attached as Exhibits 2A through 2D hereto. In addition, a composite summary of the entire Application Period (including the Current Period) showing the break-down in total expenses by project category and by type of expense is attached hereto as Exhibit 5. LeBoeuf keeps in its files appropriate detail, including receipts, invoices, reimbursement vouchers, and other supporting information concerning the expenses incurred in this representation, and that information is available for review upon request.

2. The expenses incurred by LeBoeuf for which reimbursement in this Application is sought are consistent with the U.S. Trustee Guidelines and the rules and orders applicable in this case.

G. Summary of Interim Payments Made

1. Pursuant to the Administrative Orders of this Court establishing procedures for interim compensation and reimbursement in this case, LeBoeuf has submitted five interim fee applications to the Court. 2. Pursuant to the Administrative Order, LeBoeuf has submitted invoices monthly to the Debtor, CWT, the office of the United States Trustee, counsel for the Official Committee of Unsecured Creditors, and counsel for the Official Bondholders' Committee (collectively, the "Reviewing Parties") for the Current Period (October 1, 2000 through January 3, 2001). 3. LeBoeuf seeks to have its fees and expenses allowed in the full amount set forth in this Application, but seeks payment of only the difference between the amount allowed in this Application and the amount previously paid to LeBoeuf by the estate pursuant to the submission of periodic invoices and interim fee applications as authorized under the Administrative Order and this

Court's orders approving the compensation sought by LeBoeuf in its five interim fee applications.

4. LeBoeuf understands that if the funds paid by the estate on periodic invoices or interim fee applications are in excess of the amount of compensation or reimbursement of expenses allowed in this Application, LeBoeuf will return such excess to Debtor.

H. Voluntary Reductions Made by LeBoeuf

1. Prior to submitting its invoices for services provided and expenses incurred during each of the interim periods from case commencement through September 30, 2000, to the Reviewing Parties, LeBoeuf, in exercising its billing judgment, voluntarily reduced the amount sought for fees and expenses incurred during that period by the total amount of \$32,457.08. The reductions are reflected in each of the invoices provided in LeBoeuf's five interim fee applications already on file with the Court, and are referred to in Section III.F. of the narrative portion of each such interim application.

2. Prior to submitting its invoices for the Current Period (October 1, 2000 through January 3, 2001) to the Reviewing Parties, LeBoeuf, in exercising its billing judgment, voluntarily reduced the amount sought for fees and expenses incurred during that period by \$7,946.69. The reductions are reflected in the cover sheets included with each of the invoices attached hereto as Exhibits 2A, 2B, 2C, and 2D.

I. Certification


