FINAL APPLICATION FOR REIMBURSEMENT OF EXPENSES OF THE OFFICIAL COMMITTEE OF UNSECURED CREDITORS OF NATIONAL STEEL CORPORATION FOR THE PERIOD FROM MARCH 19, 2002 THROUGH DECEMBER 19, 2003

The Official Committee of Unsecured Creditors (the "Committee") of National Steel Corporation, by and through its attorneys, hereby files its Final Application for Reimbursement of Expenses (the "Final Application") for the Period From March 19, 2002 Through December 19, 2003 (the "Final Application Period"). In support of this Final Application, the Committee states as follows:

I. <u>FACTUAL BACKGROUND - GENERAL STATUS OF CASE AND</u> JURISDICTIONAL AND STATUTORY BASIS FOR THIS APPLICATION

1. On March 6, 2002 (the "Petition Date"), the Debtors each filed voluntary petitions in this Court for reorganization relief under chapter 11 of title 11 of the United States Code, 11 U.S.C. § 101-1330 9 (as amended, the "Bankruptcy Code"). Until recently, the Debtors managed and operated their businesses as Debtors-in-Possession pursuant to sections 1107(a) and 1108 of the Bankruptcy Code.

- 2. On March 7, 2002, this Court entered that certain Administrative Order pursuant to 11 U.S.C. §§ 105(a) and 331 Establishing Procedures for Periodic Compensation of Expenses of Professionals (Docket No. 34) (the "Administrative Order").
- 3. On March 19, 2002, the United States Trustee appointed the Committee pursuant to § 1102 of the Bankruptcy Code. The Committee was comprised of the following members: EES Coke Battery, LLC, United Steelworkers, P.B.G.C., HSBC, Jewell Coke Company, L.P., Tube City, Inc., Praxair, Inc., Bearing Headquarters Co., Noble Metal Processing, Inc., and Edward C. Levy Co.
- 4. Prior to May 20, 2003, the Debtors manufactured and sold a variety of flat rolled carbon steel products and the Debtors' business was one of the largest integrated steel producers in the United States.
- 5. The Debtors were headquartered in Mishawaka, Indiana, near South Bend. Prior to May 20, 2003, the Debtors had three principal facilities: the Granite City facility in Granite City, Illinois, the Great Lakes facility in River Rouge, Michigan; and a finishing facility, the Midwest Division, in Portage, Indiana. Approximately 70% of the Debtors' customers were located in the central region of the United States where the Debtors operated their businesses.
- 6. As of the Petition Date, the Debtors owed substantial sums to a wide range of secured and unsecured creditors, including trade creditors. The Debtors were liable for more than \$1,500,000,000 in unfunded pension fund liabilities and more than \$500,000,000 in underfunded "legacy costs" pursuant to its collective bargaining agreement with the USWA. The Committee believes that, as of the Petition Date, total unsecured trade payables were in the range of \$200 million.

- 7. On May 20, 2003, the Debtors sold substantially all of their assets, including their steel making facilities, to United States Steel Corporation ("USC") for the total purchase price of \$1,050,000,000, pursuant to an Asset Purchase Agreement dated April 21, 2003 (the "Sale").
- 8. On October 23, 2003 this Bankruptcy Court confirmed the Debtors' Joint Amended Plan of Liquidation ("Plan"). On December 19, 2003, the Debtors' Plan became effective.

II. REQUEST FOR REIMBURSEMENT OF EXPENSES

- 9. On August 30, 2002, the Committee, though its undersigned counsel, filed a First Interim Application for Approval and Allowance of Reimbursement of Expenses (the "First Application") for the period from March 19, 2002 through and including July 31, 2002 requesting reimbursement of expenses in the amount of \$2,457.01. The court granted the relief requested in the First Application.
- 10. One December 26, 2002, the Committee, through its undersigned counsel, filed a Second Interim Application for Approval and Allowance of Reimbursement of Expenses (the "Second Application") for the period from August 1, 2002 though and including November 30, 2002 requesting reimbursement of expenses in the amount of \$4,553.40. The court granted the relief requested in the Second Application.
- 11. On April 25, 2003, the Committee, though its undersigned counsel, filed a Third Interim Application for Approval and Allowance of Reimbursement of Expenses (the "Third Application"). This Court preliminarily denied the relief requested in the Third Application but suggested that Recd Smith on behalf of the Committee, reapply for allowance of almost all of the expenses requested in the Third Interim Application, with the exception of a charges totaling \$3,880.90. Consequently the Fourth Interim Application sought reimbursement of the Committee

expenses requested in the Third Interim Application as reduced by \$188.13 together with additional expenses of \$1,700.20. The court granted the relief requested in the Fourth Application

- 12. Pursuant to §§ 503(b)(3)(F) and 503(b)(4) of the Bankruptcy Code, a member of the Committee may be reimbursed for actual and necessary expenses for services rendered in its capacity as a Committee member, including reasonable compensation for professionals.

 Bankruptcy Rule 2016 provides, in part, that "[a|n entity seeking interim or final compensation for services, or reimbursement of necessary expenses, from the estate shall file an application setting forth a detailed statement of (1) the services rendered, time expended and expenses incurred, and (2) the amounts requested."
- 13. Michael Azar, of Noble Metal Processing, Inc., Jerry Endler and Dave Smith of EES Coke Battery, LLC, Robert Flucker of Edward C. Levy Co., Stanley Levine, Esquire, and Thomas Lippard of Tube City, Inc., and Ajit M. Gadre, of Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation have submitted receipts for reimbursement of expenses in the aggregate amount of \$12,614.56 (which incorporates the voluntary reduction taken in the amount of \$188.13) (the "Expenses"), incurred during the Final Application Period by Noble Metal Processing, Inc., EES Coke Battery, LLC, Edward C. Levy Co., Tube City, Inc., or Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation in connection with their roles as Committee members.
- 14. A summary of the Expenses, is attached hereto as **Exhibit A** and incorporated by reference herein.
- 15. The expenses were actual and necessary and incurred by Noble Metal Processing,
 Inc., EES Coke Battery, LLC, Edward C. Levy Co., Tube City, Inc. and Pension Benefit Guaranty
 Corporation in the course of executing their duties as members of the Committee during the Final
 Application Period. The Expenses include expenses incurred attending Committee meetings and/or

hearings on March 18, 2002, March 22, 2002, April 19, 2002, September 13, 2002, January 6, 2003, January 30, 2003 and March 25, 2003.

WHEREFORE, the Committee requests an order allowing and approving the final reimbursement of the Committee members, for their actual and necessary expenses in the amount of \$12,614.56 (which incorporates the voluntary reduction taken in the amount of \$188.13) as set forth in Exhibit A, and granting such other relief as the Court deems just and proper.
