ORDERED that the Application be, and it hereby is, GRANTED; and it is further

ORDERED that in accordance with section 327(a) of the Bankruptcy Code, the Debtors are authorized to employ and retain E&Y <u>nunc pro tunc</u> to August 1, 2003 as their tax consultants and advisors on the terms set forth in the Application; and it is further

ORDERED that E&Y shall be compensated in accordance with the procedures set forth in sections 330 and 331 of the Bankruptcy Code and such Bankruptcy Rules as may then be applicable, from time to time, and such procedures as may be fixed by order of this Court.
