# APPLICATION OF RIEMER & BRAUNSTEIN LLP FOR ALLOWANCE AS A FINAL AWARD THE PREVIOUSLY REQUESTED INTERIM COMPENSATION PURSUANT TO NOVEMBER 5, 2001 ORDER PURSUANT TO SECTIONS 327 AND 328 OF THE BANKRUPTCY CODE AUTHORIZING EMPLOYMENT OF PROFESSIONALS UTILIZED IN THE ORDINARY COURSE OF BUSINESS

Riemer & Braunstein LLP (the "Law Firm"), hereby requests this Court to allow as final the prior interim awards and payments made in accordance with the **Order Pursuant to Sections 327** and 328 of the Bankruptcy Code Authorizing Employment of Professionals Utilized in the **Ordinary Course of Business**. The Law Firm's final allowance request is for services including services rendered in November and December, 2001 which exceed \$30,000.00 respectively, and which require Court approval pursuant to 11 U.S.C. §§330 and Local Rule 2016. The services rendered in this case regarded the sale of the Debtors' Photo ID Government Business. In further support of the within application, the Law Firm respectfully states as follows:

- 1. Pursuant to the Order Pursuant to Sections 327 and 328 of the Bankruptcy Code Authorizing Employment of Professionals Utilized in the Ordinary Course of Business (the "November 5th Order"), the Law Firm represented the Debtors in connection with negotiating and documenting the sale of the Debtors' identification division, as well as post-closing matters relating to certain prior sales of the Debtors' various business assets.
- 2. In accordance with the November 5<sup>th</sup> Order, the Debtors were authorized to employ ordinary course professionals, including the Law Firm.
- 3. Pursuant to Paragraph 3 of the November 5<sup>th</sup> Order, the Debtors were authorized to pay, without formal application to the Court, the requested interim fees and disbursements of each designated ordinary course professional upon submission to the Debtors of an invoice setting forth, in reasonable detail, the nature of the services rendered after the Petition Date, and calculated in

accordance with such professional's standard billing practices (without prejudice to the Debtors' right to dispute any such invoices). The Debtor did not dispute any of the Law Firms invoices. As noted in Paragraph 4 of the November 5<sup>th</sup> Order, payments to an ordinary course professional were subject to the approval of the Court in accordance with 11 U.S.C. §§330 and 331, if payments to such professional exceeded Thirty Thousand (\$30,000.00) Dollars in any one (1) month, or Three Hundred Thousand (\$300,000.00) Dollars during the entire case.

- 4. The Law Firm was paid for its October 2001 invoices (for post-petition services) which in the aggregate did not exceed Thirty Thousand (\$30,000.00) Dollars.<sup>1</sup>
- 5. The Law Firm has rendered legal services to the Debtors in connection with the sale of the Government Id Businesses for the months of November and December, 2001 as follows:
- 6. For the month of November, 2001, the Law Firm incurred and sought as interim, aggregate fees of \$35,466.50, and expenses and disbursements in the amount of \$1,226.79. Additionally, for the month of December, 2001, the Law Firm incurred and sought aggregate fees of \$52,013.50, and expenses of \$820.77 (the "Interim Application").
- 7. The Law Firm did not incur more than \$30,000.00 in any month subsequent to December, 2001, nor did the aggregate of the Law Firms services exceed the aggregate amount of \$300,000.00, as set forth in the November 5<sup>th</sup> Order. Accordingly, the Law Firm seeks allowance as final the amounts incurred by the Law Firm pursuant to its invoices, including the November and December, 2001 services.
- 8. The Law Firm previously submitted in its interim application the itemized monthly statement of services detailed with specificity, concerning the services rendered by the Law Firm during the month of November, 2001 and December, 2001.
- 9. Annexed hereto as Exhibit "D" is a summary of the hours incurred by each respective attorney for the Law Firm in connection with the amount of fees requested in the Interim Application.

10. Annexed hereto as Exhibit "E" is an itemization of the aggregate expenses incurred

for the months of November and December, 2001 as previously submitted in the Interim Application.

11. The Law Firm has rendered fees in this case at the same hourly rates that it charges

for similar cases in other matters outside the bankruptcy field.

12. There is no agreement or understanding between the Law Firm and any other person

for the sharing of compensation requested in the within Application, except among the partners of

Riemer & Braunstein LLP.

WHEREFORE, the Law Firm of Riemer & Braunstein LLP, respectfully request that

this Court enter an Order (1) awarding the Law Firm final compensation in the amount of

\$87,480.00 and expenses in the amount \$2,047.56 in connection with the services rendered for the

months of November and December 2001; and (2) allowance as final all previous payments for

invoices pursuant to the November 5, 2001 order for ordinary course professionals; and (3) granting

the Law Firm such other and further relief as this Court deems just and proper.
